4. And over her head a crown of twelve stars. *Rev 12:1*
5. And God said to the serpent, "I will put hatred between you and the woman." *Gen 3:15*
6. "Between your offspring and hers." *Gen 3:15*
7. "You will strike at her heel and she will crush your head." *Gen 3:15*
8. And the angel said to her, "The Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David." *Lk 1:32*

The First Glorious Mystery The Resurrection of Christ

Proclaim the scripture verse before each Hail Mary

1. On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb.
Jn 20:1
2. While they were puzzling over this, behold, two men in dazzling garments appeared to them. *Lk 24:4-5*
3. They said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" *Lk 24:5*
4. "He is not here. He is risen." *Mt 28:6*
5. Now that very day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus.
Lk 24:14
6. Jesus said to them, "How slow of heart you are. Did you not know the Christ must suffer, so as to enter into his glory?" *Lk 24:25-26*
7. While he was with them at table he took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to them. *Lk 24:30*
8. Then he vanished from their sight.

9. And suddenly their eyes were opened and they recognized him in the breaking of the bread. *Lk 24:31*
10. Jesus came, stood in their midst, even though the doors were locked, and said, "Peace be with you."

The Second Glorious Mystery The Ascension of Christ

Proclaim the scripture verse before each Hail Mary

1. Jesus took them outside the city.
cf Mt 28:16
2. "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." *Mt 28:18*
3. "You shall be my witnesses throughout Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." *Acts 1:8*
4. "Go, therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
Mt 28:19
5. "Teach them to observe all that I have taught you." *Mt 28:20*
6. "And know that I am with you all days, even unto the consummation of the world."
Mt 28:20
7. And while he was still speaking a cloud came upon him and took him from their sight. *Acts 1:9*
8. And they stood there looking up into the sky. *Acts 1:10*
9. Suddenly two men in white appeared beside them. *Acts 1:10*
10. "Men of Jerusalem, why do you stand here gazing up into the sky? This Jesus, who you saw leave, will return to you in the same way." *Acts 1:11*

The Third Glorious Mystery The Descent of the Holy Spirit

Proclaim the scripture verse before each Hail Mary

1. As was their custom they were gathered in the upper room praying.
cf Acts 2:1
2. Now there were Jews from every nation gathered in Jerusalem for the feast. *Acts 2:5*
3. Suddenly, a sound like a loud rushing wind was heard throughout the house.
Acts 2:2
4. Those outside the house heard it as well. *Acts 2:5*
5. And suddenly the Holy Spirit descended upon them in the form of tongues of fire which came to rest over each one of them. *Acts 2:3*
6. And they began to preach. *cf Acts 2:4*
7. And the assembled Jews said, "How is it that we can each hear them speaking in our own native tongue?" *Acts 2:8*
8. And Peter went out to the crowd and addressed them. *Acts 2:14*
9. "This Jesus of Nazareth whom you crucified God raised from the dead."
Acts 4:10
10. And that day about three thousand were added to their number. *Acts 2:41*
